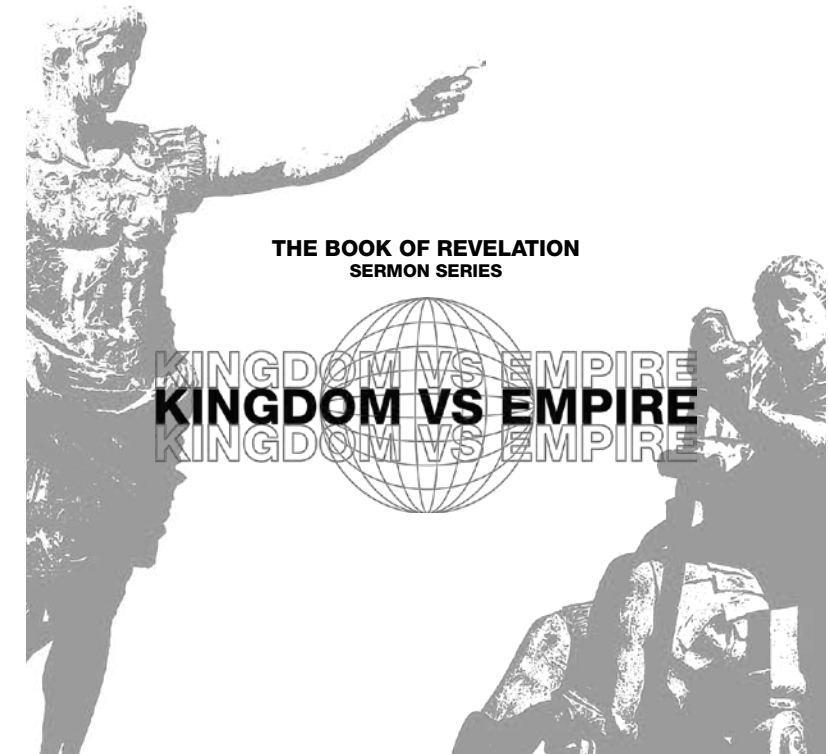

NOTES ON TODAY'S WORSHIP

In preparation for hearing Rev. 8-9 preached, which enumerates the judgement and wrath of God, we sing a paraphrase of Psalm 90, a prayer written by Moses during Israel's 40-year exile. The prayer contrasts the transient nature and littleness of humanity to the timeless greatness of God who has been our help in the past and is our hope in the future.

Moses was the first in scripture to use "rock" as an image for God in his perfection, justice, and source of physical blessings. The verses of today's spiritual cite chapters in the Bible of God's blessings and Jesus' miracles while the refrain proclaims who God is: Our rock in a weary land and our shelter in the time of storm!

Relying on the goodness and providence of God, Jesus teaches us to pray, "Give us this day our daily bread." So, we seek Jesus (*Give Me Jesus/Steal Away*) for Christ alone is our rock in whose love we stand!
